DIRECTOR CORPORATE SERVICES & FINANCE'S REPORT TO THE POLICY COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON 1 FEBRUARY 2012

1 BATHURST COMMUNITY SURVEY 2011 (02.00003)

Recommendation: That Council note the results of the 2011 Bathurst Community Survey and incorporate its findings into existing operational plans specifically in regards to the implementation of the Bathurst 2036 Community Strategic Plan.

Report: With the exception of 2010, the Bathurst Regional Council Community Survey has been conducted on an annual basis since 2001. The survey includes questions about infrastructure, lifestyle, Council facilities and services, regional priorities, Council staff and communication and current issues facing the region.

The survey aims to;

- Assess resident satisfaction with a range of services and facilities provided by Council;
- Determine the relative importance of a number of local issues within the LGA
- Provide information to assess Council's performance against past results.

In 2011 Council released the community's first Draft Bathurst 2036 Community Strategic Plan. The 2011 Community Survey provided an opportunity to test the key visions and priorities articulated in this plan. Questions in the survey are directly linked to the priorities in this plan. A more detailed report of how the community survey results impact on the Draft Bathurst 2036 Community Survey is detailed in the report to the Ordinary Meeting of Council held on 14 December 2011 (GM Report #2).

The Community survey of 610 randomly selected Bathurst Region residents was conducted by the Western Research Institute (WRI) through an anonymous telephone survey during November and December 2011.

Key findings

A copy of the survey questionnaire is shown at **attachment 1** for information.

The survey was divided into five sections covering Council's key priority areas;

- Planning and development
- Infrastructure
- The environment
- Community and Cultural facilities
- Communication with Council

Findings of the 2011 Survey revealed a slightly greater level of satisfaction with Council's ability to plan for the future as well as its performance as a professional organisation compared to previous surveys. Overall satisfaction with Council's customer service also improved since 2009 while satisfaction with Council communication, financial management and responsiveness to community concerns remained relatively stable.

Director Corporate Services & Finance's Report to the Policy Meeting 01/02/2012	
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There were upward trends in satisfaction for some infrastructure (footpaths, cycleways, parks and gardens) while satisfaction for rural and urban roads decreased. Results showed an upward trend in satisfaction for cultural facilities particularly the Bathurst Art Gallery while several questions highlighted community as an important influence in the quality of life in the Bathurst Region. The clear priority for the local environment is to make improvements to waste management, management of the natural environment and protection of local waterways.

The following details are the key findings from each of these sections;

Planning and Development

- Satisfaction with Bathurst Regional Council's planning for the future has remained relatively stable 2006-2011.
- More than one in three residents believe roads and infrastructure should be Council's main priority.
- The only new addition to the top 5 key issues since 2009 was youth services and facilities with employment no longer one of the biggest concerns.

Infrastructure

- The highest level of satisfaction was reported for parks and gardens
- Resident satisfaction with footpaths and cycleways, parks and gardens and sporting fields and amenities has trended upwards over the past seven surveys.
- The lowest levels of satisfaction were with the state of rural and urban road surfaces.

Environment

The 3 most important things Council could do to protect the natural environment were;

- to improve waste management including recycling (15%)
- to improve management of the natural environment including planting more trees(11%)
- to better protect and maintain natural waterways (10%).

Water is the top environmental issue especially to;

- improve water quality and enhancing the health of rivers and creeks (42%)
- secure a sustainable water supply and raising awareness of water issues (26%) and;
- water conservation and management was rated as residents' greatest concern overall.

Community and Culture

- Satisfaction with the Art Gallery was statistically significant recoding an upward trend of 2% per annum
- A majority of residents (86%) feel they are part of the local community compared to 77% in the 2009 survey and 81% say the quality of life in the Bathurst area is improving (an improvement on 69% of residents in 2009).
- The friendly community in the Bathurst Region was identified as the best thing about living in the area (27%); the country lifestyle (16%) and natural environment (13%) were other popular reasons.

Community and Council

- Residents say the local media (23%), Council newsletters (20%) and letterbox drops (20%) are the preferred methods of receiving information from Council.
- Preference for information from local media has dropped significantly from 77% in 2009 to 23% in 2011.
- Overall satisfaction with Council's customer service improved in all areas 2009-2011.
- Over 59% of residents surveyed had contact with Council in the last 12 months with the most common reasons being planning/building issues (13%) and water/sewerage (11%).

Director Corporate Services & Finance's Report to the Policy Meeting 01/02/2012	
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Links with Bathurst 2036

During 2011 Council embarked on an extensive round of community consultation in developing the Draft Bathurst 2036 Community Strategic Plan. The 2011 Community Survey provided an opportunity to extend this consultation and survey residents who may not have already had the opportunity to participate, with their thoughts on a number of key visions included in the plan.

To the extent that the Community Survey questions addressed themes in the 2036 Draft Plan, many of the findings are broadly supportive of its key visions in particular;

- Managing the natural environment
- The overall management of water for the community and environment
- Infrastructure development, primarily road related but also with considerable support for the extension of communication services;
- Facilitating the provision of extended health and aged care services; and
- Extending support for teenagers and youth, the elderly and the disabled.

<u>Financial Implications</u>: Funding for this item is contained within existing budgets.
