









### HISTORY

This site was occupied by Jay's tinsmithing works in 1873. It was owned by G. and J. Palmer in the 1880s and 1890's. Tenders for the erection of a shop and residence on the corner were called by James Hine on 23 April 1887. When erected in 1888 the shop, called the Centennial Stores, was occupied by W.H. Rickard, Jun & Co., grocers and importers. It was a two-storey face-brick building with stucco entablature, parapet, architraved windows, a single-storey verandah with cast iron posts and decoration, and large plate glass display windows. Other merchants occupied it later; in 1924 it was Bolton's furniture shop and by 1930, with several different occupancies, it was known as the Beehive Corner. The 'Esmore' was the outcome of a building application made in August 1955 by A.L. Morse, accountant, on behalf of Esmore Pty Ltd, for the erection of shops and offices. It is known that part of the 19th-century building is incorporated in the present one. Further alterations and additions were made for Esmore Pty Ltd in 1972.





The Carillon War Memorial was opened and dedicated on 11 November 1933. It has 35 bells, is some 30m tall and its footings required underground piles 12 m deep. The first meeting to consider a memorial was held in January 1920 and much discussion centred on whether the memorial should have a practical as well as a commemorative purpose. It was decided that it should be a memorial only, a competition was held and prizes announced, but nothing further happened. Then a design was commissioned from the sculptor Gilbert Doble, who had the Evans Memorial, but still nothing eventuated. The project was revived in 1926 and it was decided to accept the suggestion made by G.H. Hoskins that a memorial carillon be built. A design for the tower by architect John D. Moore was accepted and bells were ordered from Loughborough in England. Work on the tower began in 1929. At the official opening on Amistice Day 1933. 15 000 people were present.

The success of the carillon made desirable the redesign of King's Parade and this was done by Mr Kefford, the Curator. The carillon was flood-lit at the end of 1936.




#### DESCRIPTION

The Carillon Memorial is a tall and beautifully built brick landmark tower in the Inter-War Art Deco style, with a touch of Gothic provided by the pointed arches of the topmost openings. The essentially square form steps inwards from the base towards the top in a most effective gradation of forms evoking a Medieval quality, especially when modelled by sunlight. It is an exemplar of brick detailing, extracting the most from a traditional material yet creating a design that was at the time, dramatically modern. Its location relative to the intersection of the longitudinal and lateral areas of the Parade is also very effective.

#### HISTORY

There was a small court house at Bathurst in Macquarie's time. A new building, designed by Mortimer Lewis, Colonial Architect, was erected in 1837. After numerous alterations and additions it was finally demolished and replaced by the present building, which was designed in the office of Lewis's most illustrious successor. The east and west wings were designed for the Postal and Telegraph offices, were in use three years earlier and were linked to the main building by colonnades. The bell turret surmounting the pediment of the two-storey portico and the clock were added in 1899. The east wing is now the headquarters and museum of the Bathurst District Historical Society, while the west wing is occupied by the Central Western Music centre.

Incidentally, there is no truth in the story that this design was intended for India. It is entirely the output of Barnet's office for this particular location.

#### DESCRIPTION


A remarkable group of Victorian Free Classical buildings, axially disposed about its impressive octagonal dome. The central court complex, with its main buildings parallel to Russell Street, is flanked by the projecting east and west wings, with their semicircular colonnades, which embrace the central forecourt, bestowing great spatial character on the group. The powerful design is indicative of the skill and quality of the Colonial Architect's office under Barnet and a potent symbol of justice and the rule of law. It also symbolises the importance of Bathurst as an important inland centre. The array of traditional materials includes sandstone, brick, copper, timber, wrought iron and cast iron, all displaying high quality design and workmanship. One of James Barnet's own architectural 'inventions' is also in evidence: it is the device of the bifurcated outer piers of the portico; they are coursed sandstone ashlar up to about two-thirds of the height, at which point each wide pier becomes two square piers continuing up to the capitals. Mannerist devices such as this bespeak the 'free' approach to Classical architecture possible at the hands of a master like Barnet.

The setting of the Court House is a focus for the townscape of Bathurst. It is at once the key element of Russell Street, the dominant feature overlooking Machattie Park, and the eminent closure of an axial vista that includes the Carillon and the Cathedral. Its streetscape relationships with the Civic Centre on the east and the Park including the Cathedral Gates on the west are also important.

#### HISTORY

The site is that of the first All Saints' Church (later Cathedral), of which the foundation stone was laid on 24 January 1845. The first services were held on 6 August 1848. The architect was Edmund Blacket. By the early 20th Century the building was declared unsafe, so much so that the bells could not be rung. In a campaign intended progressively to replace the cathedral, rebuilding commenced, the foundation stone of the eastern portion being laid on Anzac Day, 25 April 1920, but Lieutenant General Sir William Birdwood. It was designed by the Melbourne architect Louis Williams. The 1930s depression, World War II and other more pressing diocesan needs prevented completion of any more of William's design. When the project was reactivated it was to a completely different design taking account of the liturgical revival. This was the work of the Sydney firm of McPherson, Harrison & Hassall. The last service in the old Cathedral was held on 5 July 1970, after which the building was finally demolished, except for the 1920 portion, and the new cathedral commenced. It was consecrated on 16 October 1971. The project is still not complete, for the Bishop's, Dean's and Servers' vestries have yet to be completed and a free-standing bell-tower erected. The six bells to hung in the tower are stored in the Court House complex.






The Cathedral is a free-standing brick-clad building of hexagonal plan, with an almost flat roof from the centre of which rises a tall metal spire motif. It is sited on the lateral axis which links the Court House and the Carillon. The retained portion of the earlier building (the first section replacing the original cathedral) is attached beyond the east side of the nave. The main entrance is on the south, from Church Street, and is marked by a full-height window separating the flanking facets of the plan. Full height brick buttress motifs emphasise the form of building. The interior features very large wall hangings by Charles Coburn.

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
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



There was a long dispute between two factions in the early 1870s. One wanted the new school erected on the old gaol site and the other wanted that site to be a park. The latter group won, the old gaol was demolished and the site turned into Machattie Park. The losers eventually settled for this position in Howick Street. It was stated in the *Bathurst Times* on 23 August 1873 that it was believed the Telegraph Station site plus some adjoining land, and one-and-a-half acres all told, would be granted for a public school. This was done. The Public School opened in this building 1878. The school moved to the top end of George Street in the 1930s and the old building was unoccupied. In World War II it was used as a canteen and recreation centre for service men and women stationed in Bathurst. The forerunner of TAFE occupied it in 1948.




A substantial building of Bathurst red-brown bricks trimmed with rubbed reds, in the picturesque Victorian Free Gothic style seen in much of George Allen Mansfield's work. The walling is well-laid in Flemish bond and the fairly steep roof is covered in slate. The street front, set back from the building line, has two prominent gables of unequal size, with projecting bargeboards and a quatrefoiled timber screen in each apex. The windows in these gables have brick arches, label moulds and square label stops. The windows in the west gable have decorative stone spandrels. A small buttressed portico on the east has an arched doorway and a foiled parapet. Between the main gables there are three windows with lintels surmounted by relieving arches and steep gablets. At the west end there is a tower having an arched entrance at its base and with brick panelling, grouped windows and a transitional pyramidal roof with eyebrow domer vents, culminating in a polygonal lantern topped by a slender spire. Behind the tower there is a yard enclosed by the rear wing of the building, designed with similar form and detailing. The site includes landscape elements.



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

On the corner is the Rural Bank (without verandah) which in later years housed Jims Tighe's Mensworld. It's now the home of LJ Hooker Real Estate.

Further left is Raffins Mens and Boys Wear, Coles and Moran and Cato.

On the extreme left is Mockler Brother Department Store which was destroyed by fire in December 1959.

The site was later sold to Woolworths which opened a department store there on September 20, 1961.

The site is currently being redeveloped as the Centrepoint shopping arcade.


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2MK began transmission on October, 31, 1925, offering a limited service of news and music.

Wireless Weekly magazine of August 1, 1930 (price 3d) listed 2MK among prominent radio stations of Australia.

2MK broadcast on a frequency of 1155 kilocycles with a power of 250 watts.

After its closure in the early 1930s, Bathurst had to wait until January 1, 1937, before 2BS began transmission.


