GUIDELINES

Exempt from Council inspection

Members of Child's Amusement Ride Operators Association (CARO) whose rides are exempted under Exemption Certificate 4179 and which are set up on private land. Councils are to be advised as follows in relation to these devices:

- Location and date(s) of setting up and operation of device.
- Details of registration and insurance.

The owner of the device is to accept responsibility for setting up of the device in accordance with the conditions of registration and for ensuring adequacy of the foundation material.

Safety guidelines for inflatable amusement devices

NOTE These devices do not need to be registered with WorkCover.

- ☐ Check that application has been made to carry out operation of amusement device.
- ☐ Check insurance cover (same as for other amusement devices).
- ☐ A copy of the manufacturer's erecting and operating instructions must be kept with the device and be legible.
- ☐ All ropes attached to the device must be used and replaced where damaged or missing.
- ☐ NOT to be used in winds greater than 45km/h (strong breeze, large branches in motion, whistling heard in telegraph wires, umbrellas used with difficulty).

Paved	To be securely tied on each side, to a secure fence or other permanent structure or motor vehicle ALTERNATIVELY not less than eight (8) concrete blocks at least 30kg in weight may be used, or weights in accordance with manufacturer's requirements	

Springs or rubber links may be used between ropes and anchorages. Rubber links shall incorporate a backup rope loop in case rubber fails.
