






Community Recycling Centres

You can drop off:



Only household quantities accepted 20kg or 20L maximum container size. Please transport your materials carefully. Dangerous goods and items other than those listed will not be accepted.

Hours: Monday to Friday: 7.30am–4.30pm Saturday and Sunday: 8.30am–3pm (Closed Christmas Day and Good Friday)

Many of these materials can be reused and recycled if processed correctly. Recycling helps our environment because it saves water, energy and natural resources.

How to recycle other household items:



Visit www.cleanout.com.au to find your nearest CleanOut event to safely dispose of your household chemicals.



Return unwanted or out-dated **medicine** to your local pharmacy for safe disposal.



Recycle old **mobile phones**, batteries, chargers and other accessories in the special container at the Bathurst Waste Management Centre or the Council Civic Centre at 158 Russell St Bathurst.



Drop off your used **printer cartridges** at participating Australia Post, Officeworks, Harvey Norman and Dick Smith Electronics stores.



All types of **E-Waste** including computers, TV's and DVD's, gaming consoles, music devices and 2 accessories or cables can all be taken to the Bathurst Waste Management Centre and placed in the specially marked E-Waste bays. Fees and charges apply.
